Roadway Needs Report:	Follow Up: The BU student who lives at UClub continues to advocate for pedestrian safety improvements on Plaza Drive, Oxford Place and on Murray Hill Road. BMTS has worked with her and the Town Engineer to put together a proposal that includes edge striping to provide pedestrian space & narrow travel lanes, adding crosswalks, and pedestrian signs. Follow Up to Previous Meeting Items:	the Floor time at the September 16 Town Board meeting, presenting the need and proposed changes. Unfortunately, the Town Supervisor was not supportive, saying he thought the proposal would cost \$50,000. BMTS spoke with the Town Engineer who thought the cost would be closer to \$5,000. BMTS will continue provide technical assistance to the student upon her request. Committee members suggested that the student organize a fundraiser, for the proposed improvements since the estimated cost is so low.  Susan said that Jillian (NYSDOT) thought it would be a stretch to fund striping the entire length of Plaza Dr. as part of the Rt. 434 Greenway Project. Scott &amp; Ashley plan to use flex tape and paste to resolve the water issue with the manhole.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Route 434 Greenway         <ul> <li>A contractor will be chosen during the first week of November.</li> <li>Construction will take place in 2021 and 2022, though some construction may begin by the end of 2020.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Route 363 Project         <ul> <li>There is no detailed update for this project. A dry-run for a public information meeting was cancelled at the last minute recently, and was not rescheduled.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Other: Agency/Dept. Updates	<ul> <li>NYSDOT – Susan reported that the Clayton Ave. &amp; Rt. 434 Signal Project is moving forward, though The Vestal Bakery opposes the sidewalk on Clayton Ave. that will block a side driveway. There appears to be plenty of room for access on the service road.</li> <li>Chenango Canal Towpath Bike Ride – Ashley shared about her "century ride" from Utica to Binghamton following the Chenango Canal Towpath. The ride consisted of roadway and multi-use trail. They did ride on I-88 for the last stretch into Binghamton rather than using the steep Crocker Hill Rd. route. A police car passed by them and did not stop them from using the section of highway. The entire ride took about 7.5 hours of riding time, plus time at stops along the way.</li> </ul>
