Historic Binghamton Bridge Pedal 2006:

On July 9 the Historic Binghamton Bridge Pedal for 2006 will depart from the north end of the Washington Street Bridge. Following the entire route at a leisurely pace gives a forty minute ride ending back at the Washington Street Bridge. Starting around 9:00 AM we must clear the route by 11:00 AM. Police escorts will help secure our ride.

By car: unlaod bikes at MacArthur Park. Ride east on Vestal Ave. to Pennsylvania Ave. then north over 434 to the historic Washington Street Bridge. People biking to the event should gather on the historic Washington Street Bridge to meet other riders before the start.

Everyone must sign a release to go on the ride.

The route:

Leave the north end of Washington Street Bridge and take the path into Confluence Park. Follow the bike path under Riverside Drive and north along the Chenango River until it connects up with Water Street. Then take Water Street south back to Riverside Drive going west taking Memorial Birdge over the bike path and over the river.

Turn right onto Front Street headed north. Follow Front Street across Main Street continuing north to East Clinton Street turning right onto the East Clinton Street Bridge again crossing the Chenango River.

Turn right onto the promenade following south along the Chenango River.


Get off the promenade at the Martin Luther King park and take Henry Street east to Chenango Street.

Turn right to head south on Chenango Street toward the Broome County Court House.

At Court Street angle left following the curve to Exchange Street south.

Follow south to the Exchange Street Bridge across the Susquehanna River, getting a good look at Rockbottom Dam from the bridge.

Once across the river turn right onto Conklin Avenue going west back to the south end of the Washington Street Bridge.
